

Ontario Association of Veterinary Technicians 2017 Wage Survey Results

Average RVT Wage: \$21.06/hr

The OAVT's annual wage survey showed some promising trends in 2017. Wages showed an overall increase year-to-year. Data gathered from over 1000 RVTs who participated in the wage survey showed an average wage of \$21.06 per hour. That is up from \$20.41 in the 2016 wage survey, representing a three percent increase in wages between the two years.

Also on the rise are work benefits. The number of RVTs reporting benefits from their employers rose steadly in almost every category. RVTs receiving their OAVT dues from their place of employment rose from 59% in 2015 to 62% in 2017. Programs such as profit sharing, retirement savings plans, and clothing allowances are on the rise as well.

The Highs And the Lows

- 4% of respondents made less than \$15 per hour. Of that 4%:
 - 60% were between the ages of 18 and 25
 - 85% have been in the industry for four years or less
- Roughly 7% of respondents made more than \$30 per hour. Of that 7%:
 - 65% were between the ages of 35 and 50
 - 25% have additional credentials
 - Two thirds have been working in this industry for 13+ years
 - A quarter have been working in this industry for 20+ years

RVT Wages in Northern Ontario

Data from the following regions: Algoma, Porcupine, Huron, Northwestern/Dryden, Timiskaming and Thunder Bay, was not able to be included in the RVT Wages by Location chart because each area received less than 10 responses. While the OAVT cannot provide an average for each of these areas, we can share the information we gathered from these regions as a whole.

Northern Ontario is a large geographic area with a large range of wages. From the 26 responses received, wages in these areas ranged from \$15.00/hr-\$41.00/hr with an overall average of \$20.58. 67% of respondents work in conventional small animal hospitals, 23% work in conventional mixed animal hospitals, and the remaining 10% work in other areas like education and research. Overall these regions saw a higher amount of benefits than the rest of the province with only 3% of RVTs not receiving any benefits compared to the provincial 7.5% average.
