

## Rabies Suspect Animals Who To Call When



Potential Human Exposure

Potential Domestic Animal Exposure  $\rightarrow$ 

Report potential human exposures to your local Public Health Unit (PHU). If testing is required PHU staff will contact the OAVT Rabies Response Program (RRP) to dispatch a Registered Veterinary Technician (RVT) for specimen collection.

Animal Owners should report potential animal exposures to their Veterinarian.

Veterinarians can submit a request for assistance online at http://www.omafra.gov.on.ca/rabiesrequest. Requests can be submitted 24/7. Those submitted within business hours will typically receive a reply within 1-2 hours. If a Veterinarian requires assistance with completing the online form due to limited internet access or due to any other accessibility issue, please contact the OMAFRA Agricultural Information Contact Centre at 1-877-424-1300 (option 1) during business hours (weekdays 8:30 AM – 4:30 PM).
